Community

New Frontiers Public School District serves the educational needs of San Antonio, TX, Bexar County and surrounding areas. Currently, the district consists of one early college high school, and one K-8 Academy. The student body is culturally diverse with a population that is 93% Hispanic, 1.4% African American, and 4.9% white. The district is 85% economically disadvantaged with an 11% ELL population.

School

Frank L. Madla Early College High School is a four-year public high school enrolling approximately 200 students in grades 9–12. The school opened in the fall of 2014 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2018. Frank L. Madla Early College High School is accredited by the Texas Education Agency where the designation as an early college high school has been earned. With this designation, students may earn up to 60 college hours or an Associate's Degree. Frank L. Madla Early College High School holds membership with College Board.

Curriculum

The academic program is organized to mirror the college schedule. Students are on a rotating block schedule. Each semester students take different electives to go with their core classes. The majority of electives offered are designed to meet college degree plan requirements for an Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts. The college electives that a student takes that are offered at Palo Alto College are taught by the Palo Alto Faculty in a traditional college setting.

The school does not offer AP® courses or IB courses. Dual credit courses are the sole higher level courses offered.

Rank

Students are ranked with other classmates in their graduating class. Ranking is determined by the students' average on a 100 point scale.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all courses which a student receives credit, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 26 credits are **required for graduation**. In addition, each student may earn up to 60 college hours towards an Associate's Degree. Dual Credit courses are calculated at a higher rate than courses not counting for college credit. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in January and May.

There are 40 students in the class of 2018.
